







Specific Authority


- 23.2.3.The first referee has the power to decide any matter involving the game including those not provided for in the Rules
- 23.2.4. The first referee shall not permit any discussion about his/her decisions.


However, at the request of the **game captain**, the first referee will give an explanation on the application or interpretation of the Rules upon which he/she has based the decision

Research



- According to Goldsmith and Williams (1992), volleyball referees have a 'fear of failure' as the general stressor
- In a study of personality, Balch & Scott (2007) discover volleyball referees had average personality scales, whilst athletes and spectators perceive referees have lower personality scores. They suggest this mismatch in personality could be because of the negative attitudes
- Robazza (2002) tried to use IZOF on referees and found very rich profiles and they were very individualised
- Van Yperen (1998) recommends a fair promotion system for better games and positive affective responses towards officiating so that Referee's continue
