Brief Conference Account

41st European Muscle Conference, 1-5 September, Rhodes, Greece

The annual conference of the <u>European Society for Muscle Research</u>, took place for the first time in Greece, organized by Christina Karatzafei (<u>University of Thessaly</u>) and G. K. Sakkas (<u>Center for Research Technology Thessaly</u>), at the island of Rhodes.



More than 180 delegates (45% women) from 27 different countries from all over the world attended the 41st European Muscle Conference (41st EMC). While the majority of attendees (78%) came from within Europe, we also welcomed representatives from North America (16%), as well as from Asia, South & Central America, Australia and Africa.

Truly interesting and novel work was presented and for the first time 'snap presentations' were introduced to maximize exposure of work presented in the poster sessions.

Two European Networks, <u>MUZIC</u> and <u>MYOAGE</u> actively participated by sponsoring respective scientific sessions. Moreover, MYOAGE sponsored the Keynote Lecture session (Prof Stefano Schiaffino, Venetian Institute of Molecular Medicine, Italy). The conference was implemented by the conference organizing agency <u>SYMVOLI</u>.
